


APPENDIX: DEI Data Deep Dive February 2023





Diversity, Equity, Inclusion (DEI) Measures are New in 2022

The Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion section of the Census was new in 2022 and measured sentiment on 14 different adjective pairs that represent the opposite ends of a sentiment range. For example, the first adjective pair below is "Hostile/Friendly" and respondents could choose: very [hostile], somewhat [hostile], somewhat [friendly], or very [friendly], and in the data below, you will see that 51% identified the greater Austin music ecosystem as "friendly" (aggregating somewhat and very friendly) and 19% identified it as hostile (aggregating somewhat and very hostile).










